## Advanced Academic Writing

- Purpose:** The purpose with this course is to give participants opportunity to train practical skills within manuscript writing and revision, grants applications and budget work.
- Goals:**

| <b>Values and attitude</b>         | In order to pass the participant must <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• show respect for deadlines</li><li>• show commitment to the writing tasks</li></ul>  |
- Content:** Free, creative manuscript writing for journal-specific templates, writing of rebuttal letters and revised manuscripts, free, creative grant application writing to a grant source, budget work.
- Structure:** The course consists of one common introductory lecture and five mandatory individual written assignments.
- Examination:** For a pass, all assignments must have been submitted on time, and executed according to certain minimal requirements (all mandatory sections filled out without plagiarisms).
- Length:** The course corresponds to five weeks of work, resulting in 7.5 university study points (range UG) of the graduate student's curriculum, if compatible with the individual study plan.
- Eligibility:** For BME people, no other strict requirements. The applicant should preferably be a graduate student or postdoc with previous participation in one or several of the courses: *Akademiskt skrivande/ Writing in English at University, Academic Writing for Publication in the Engineering and Science Disciplines, Reading Skills and the*

*Discourse of the Research Article* or similar.

- Selection:** In case of an excess in number of applications, priority will be given to: 1) graduate (PhD) students, 2) those who have taken several of the courses mentioned above, 3) those who took at least one of the courses mentioned, 4) others.  
Max 15 participants.
- Language:** English.
